Greetings to all our personal supporters:

Tomorrow, our fifth group of the summer leaves for the States, and our sixth group arrives. Each week has been a blessing, and so many of our American friends have had their lives touched. I wish you could all visit for a week, maybe in the summer of 2025. Many have come to Christ, while others have dedicated their lives to serving Him. Today, a group from Tabernacle Baptist in Orlando hosted the local high school. We had about 230 students, and probably ten or twelve teachers spend several hours with us enjoying a meal and playing so many games. It was a blessing to have this outreach to the youth. Once again, as we walk around town, grab a taxi, or eat at a restaurant, we are constantly served and approached by young adults with children who grew up in our feeding centers. Almost all our staff are such "kids," and those who are not have been serving in our various kitchens for up to nineteen years. Next November will be the twentieth anniversary of Touch a Life, and we are now feeding children in Honduras, Ukraine, Egypt, other Middle Eastern countries, Pakistan, India, Cambodia, Kenya, and other lands I have forgotten. Thank you for making this wonderful ministry a possibility.

Final Frontiers and our Great Commission Fund are also booming, as always. Your combined giving is helping us take on more national church planters, not one at a time as before but ten, twenty, forty, or fifty at a time. I never dreamed such growth would be possible while I was still so "young." I am approaching the age of sixty-eight but still have energy and reason (from time to time). God willing, I have many more productive years ahead of me.

Please pray for our economic situation. This summer, severe mishaps cost us up to \$40,000. I sent out a letter explaining them, but less than \$3,000 has been received. These are not personal issues but ministry, otherwise I would never ask you for help. Please pray and help if you can.

Do you like coffee? Well, at long last we will soon be selling our brand of coffee from Honduras. It is called ... Touch a Life Coffee I bet you didn't see that coming. It is a premium coffee, organically grown in local family farms at elevations over a mile high. We hope to sell cases to churches for their classes, offices, and homes. The profit will go directly to purchasing food, opening more feeding centers, and enhancing the ministries of the local churches that our men plant and pastor. Expect to hear more about this very soon, then enjoy a cup and feed a child as you do.

God willing, when I return home in late August, I will fulfill some speaking engagements and then head off to Vietnam, Thailand, Laos, and maybe Cambodia and Myanmar. We're still busy with our Father's business and are very thankful to those of you who support our family.
