We sat down at a pizza place and chatted for a while. As when we first arrived on the mainland, I waited for the Holy Spirit to open a door of opportunity. Sure enough, the door opened. Ted had started learning the piano when he was eight years old. I said, "That is great. I started learning something that changed my life at eight years old as well!" He was naturally curious and asked what it was. I told him, "That is when I learned about why Jesus died on the Cross." With that statement, I asked if they knew anything about that topic. Neither Ted nor Sunny knew a lot, though Ted had gone to a Catholic high school. I asked if I could explain it to them, and they agreed. I was able to share the full Gospel message with them and then asked them if they had any questions. Both replied "No questions." So, I asked, "Would you like to accept Jesus as your Saviour right now?" The silence was very prevalent. I could see Ted was interested but not ready to commit just yet. Sunny was uncomfortably waiting for Ted to say something. So, after a minute or two, I gave them an escape, and both of them took it. Then we continued our previous discussion. I invited them to church and told them to text me if they had any questions about the Bible. The seed was planted, and we are praying that, with a little watering and weeding, Ted and Sunny will decide to trust Jesus soon.

We were also approached by a lady asking for someone to teach her the Bible so she could share the Gospel with all her friends and neighbors.
