Dear Galatians 6:1 Ministries Family and Friends,

Perhaps the most exciting development right now is the release of our new book: <u>Mercy for Me: A Journey Through David's Prayer of Restoration in Psalm 51</u>. This book is now available on our website, and we would love for you to get a copy for yourself or someone you care about.

This book is deeply personal. It began not as a project for others, but as a study for David's own heart. Years ago, he walked through the brokenness of Psalm 51 and wrote down what God was teaching him—line by line, truth by truth. For a long time, those thoughts stayed private. But over time, as God opened doors to help others who had fallen, these same truths were shared, and then passed on again and again.

Now, it's available for anyone who truly desires to be restored, strengthened, and drawn back into deep fellowship with the Lord. It's a 36-day devotional, walking through David's prayer Monday through Saturday for six weeks. If you've ever asked, "How could David be restored after such failure?"—this book shows you how. It's not a secret. David truly repented—and the steps he took are laid out in Psalm 51.

This is a book about restoration. But more than that—it's about getting truly right with God.

We hope you'll order a copy, take notes, do a personal inventory, and let the Word do its work in your life. Restoration doesn't happen casually—it requires reflection, honesty, and humility before God. This book will help guide you through that process.
