Dear Friends of Restoration,

Not because of us, but because of *Him*. We simply get to be a part of what **He** is doing.

As we step into the month of June, we ask you to **keep praying**:

- For **continued strength** to carry this burden.
- For **good health**—especially for Brenda, who is doing better than she has all year.
- For **financial provision**. Summer always brings added costs, and as always, **God provides through His people**—friends like you.
- For the many **hurting people** we help every day—who are broken, ashamed, and desperately in need of **grace and restoration**.
