While I lead in a salvation prayer for those watching online or people in the auditorium who did not have a soul-winner talking to them, Aminadab decided to pray to trust Christ.

Later, one of my assistant pastors named David asked him if he wanted to be saved. He said, "I just was!" He showed him the pistol and told him the story. Later during follow up, he said, "If I had killed that man, I would have gone to jail and then to hell. Now I am going to heaven and know God is real." He gave my assistant his gun and said, "I don't need this now."
