As we look ahead to our upcoming transition, there are also some changes taking place in Bolivia. While the incoming president, Rodrigo Paz, was not the one we were hoping for, we’re praying that God will use him to strengthen ties with the U.S. and preserve religious freedom. We also want to let you know that we won’t be able to receive mail from the U.S. while in Bolivia, so we’ll be relying on digital communication during our time there. We rejoiced this month to see James, a teenager reached through soulwinning, and Kekante, an eight-year-old boy during our first-timers’ service, both trust Christ as Savior! On Carnival Sunday at our sending church, we had over 350 in attendance, with eight adult visitors and many decisions for Christ. We’re also praising the Lord that the last of our apostille certifications arrived—the final documents needed to apply for residency in Bolivia.

Please continue praying for Bolivia, as gas and food shortages have become a concern, and for God’s continued provision, health, and protection as we prepare to move.
