- Fellowship Baptist Church, Trafalgar, IN What an honor to "fill in" while Pastor Ron and his wife took some much-needed rest! We were grateful to serve and give them space to recharge.
- Lamont, IL We took a little trip to see where Charlie Kirk's work began and paid our respects. We saw a clear example of a man repeatedly giving the gospel plainly and faithfully to young people hungry for truth.
- Faith Baptist Church, Fredericksburg, VA So blessed to join nine couples sold out for the cause of Christ at our Missions Conference! We are so thankful for Pastor Kurt, Pastor Josh, and a congregation that loves foreign missions.
- Valley Baptist Church, Mesa, AZ Wendy flew to Arizona and spoke to around 300 ladies who gathered for a time of rejuvenation and revival as they learned to RISE ABOVE in all of life's circumstances.
