# Remember when...

I thought I would share with our supporters the details of the animals we now use in the program.

Many years ago, as a child I saw a cowboy named Ken Bowen come to our church with a horse and there started my dream of being a cowboy preacher with animals to present the gospel. Later as an Assistant Pastor I ran into Evangelist Bill Lystlund who at one point in his ministry had a little mini named Bullet that traveled with him. When I saw Bro. Bill the next time, I expressed my dream of having a horse.

Back in 2008 or so Bill Lystlund called me to ask me if I was still interested in having a miniature horse to train and use in the program. Of course, I answered with a hardy, "YES". He ended up buying one that a friend of his was selling. I got a friend of mine in Tennessee to pick up Champ and keep him for a few years in his pastures. Eventually, I changed my trailer to accommodate a horse and picked him up in 2011 to take him to a trainer I found in Florida. We left him in the capable hands of this trainer for six months. In June, I drove back to pick him up where the trainer trained me and the rest is history. I'll never forget the first time I used him in a church in Bonita Springs, Florida. I have done his routine thousands of times in the last 14 years. I never tire of it. I love using this horse.

He brings in the crowds. When I am out visiting with him, he draws folks out of their homes to see him. A memory comes back from visiting in Louisiana where we were in a trailer park. A lady literally ran out the door putting on her robe to see the horse. When we left the house with a promise of her coming the next day with her two daughters, the preacher informed me that she had ran him off her porch the week before. But a horse comes and she is all smiles. He has a way of breaking down barriers. The lady actually came and sat on the front row with her daughters and when the invitation was given they all walked the aisle for salvation.

Next in 2015 we were in California when Pastor Matt Gibbs teased me about getting a dog to have a real "Dog and Pony Show". Little did he know that I had thought of doing just that. I just didn't know when and how. The next year in January when we were traveling to Florida for our winter tour of meetings, Bro. Tom Young asked me if I wanted a dog. I don't remember having told Tom that I wanted one, but I told him right then about Bro. Gibbs saying that months ago and thinking about adding a dog to the performance. He assured me that a stray had shown up to his horse who he thought would be an ideal one for me. (Tom is somewhat of a dog expert to me so I knew this had to be a match made in Heaven).

I got to Tom's home church yard, he brought a small white fluff ball who sat on Champ's saddle and rode around like she had done for years. She didn't jump off but was willing to ride forever. I knew this was the dog that had brought to me. For another month every morning I worked with Dixie on about fifteen tricks. I was doing a chapel service for First Baptist Church of South Brevard in Melbourne, Florida. My family was in the service and was so shocked when I had them let go of Dixie where she ran to me in front of the audience. I proceeded to see their amazement as she did her tricks that taught the children to want to please their parents.
