Greetings from South Korea,

We thank God for you this holiday season. The past few months have been some of the busiest we've experienced all year. We hosted our annual Youth Revival Conference and Vacation Bible Camp, and the Lord worked powerfully. Several pastors and I preached on sanctification and the truth that God created each of us with a specific purpose. God answered prayer and moved in the hearts of our young people—especially our college students, who showed a genuine tenderness to the Holy Spirit's prompting. We had around 60 kids, 66 teens and 30 college helpers throughout the week. 11 precious souls trusted Christ as their Savior. Thank you for lifting our people in prayer as we served the young folks from churches all over this region of South Korea.

Not long after the conferences, the Korean Thanksgiving holiday arrived. We celebrated on the last Friday of September with a "Night of Praise." One of our church members organized an outdoor service filled with families and ministry teams singing about the goodness of God. Many of the people in nearby apartments heard the praises echoing through the evening air. It was a sweet and memorable time for our church family.

After that event, we took advantage of the holiday break to visit family in America. It was the first time my mother had all of us—children and grandchildren—in one place. My niece asked me to baptize her, which was a real honor. She has been attending a Bible-believing church for several years now, growing in her understanding of God's grace and salvation. It's a blessing to see the Lord working in my family's hearts, even though I've been half a world away for many years.

We cherished our time with my 95-year-old mother, my brothers, their wives, and all their children and grandchildren. My son also arranged a visit with an old military friend who attended our church years ago when he and his family were stationed here in Korea. God sent that family to us during a very trying time in our ministry, and their encouragement meant more than they'll ever know. This short reunion was no different, strengthening, refreshing, and just what we needed before heading back to the field.

After returning to Korea, our church was able to visit the military chapel a few times. We are scheduled for five meetings there in 2026; please pray the Lord will work through us to bring the Gospel to the young men of Korea. Since our last prayer letter, we've had 34 first-time visitors, 20 salvations, and 7 baptisms.

Our Christmas program this year is about the King of Kings and Lord of lords. The program will be filled with the Biblical prophecies about His incarnation, His life and passion, and His glorious return. Our prayer is that souls would be saved and that God's people would be encouraged to be ready and looking for His return.
