Greetings from South Korea!

Though it is still early in the year, we are happy to report that God has already begun to bless the many outreach ministries of our church. We continue to make weekly visits to nursing homes, conduct military chapel services, and preach the Gospel each week at a local high school.

In addition to the three young children who were saved this week through the Patch the Pirate Club ministry of our church, since our last prayer letter we have seen 40 salvations, 6 baptisms, and 49 first-time visitors.

As many of you know, one of the many ministries of our church is a Christian school. With the Korean school year beginning in February, our school started its 17th year with the addition of a part-time math teacher, Brother Lee, for our middle and high school curriculum.

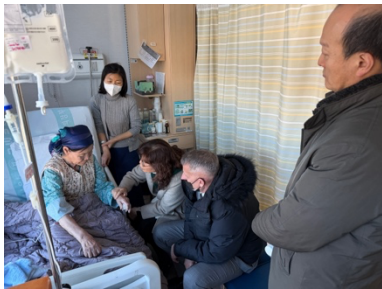
