Dear Faithful Friends,

God has been so good to us. After finishing our 10-week furlough in the States, we arrived safely back home in Dumaguete just in time to participate in one of the busiest and most fruitful seasons of our year. It was a blessing to be with so many faithful churches during our travels, and it was also a great joy to return to the place where God has allowed us to serve.

Our Vacation Bible School was held April 27 – May 1, with the theme of “GPS.” Monday through Thursday, our workers conducted 29 meetings in different locations, taking VBS out where the children could come easily and where their families could see and hear what was being taught. On Friday, we held the finale at the church. Nearly 700 children took part during the week, and over 300 children were personally dealt with and trusted Christ as Saviour. We are thankful for the many church members, including teenagers, who jumped in and labored to make the week possible. It is always a blessing to see our people serving together and investing in the next generation.

The following week, I had the privilege of preaching for Bro. Galyean and Crossroads Baptist Church in Urdaneta. Their camp was held May 11-15, with the theme of “Will You Be the One?” I preached 8 times, including split sessions on purity with both the young men and the young ladies. Over 160 teens attended from several churches. Many made decisions to serve God, go to Bible college, let God use their hurts, and keep themselves pure. One of the most impactful services may have been the night we started in the dark without power. God met with us in a special way, and it was a reminder that His work does not depend on perfect circumstances.

The very next week, May 19-21, our church hosted our annual Youth Rally. Our theme was “SOBER.” We had 184 young people in attendance from several churches, including groups from Bacolod and as far away as Cebu. In those few days, the young people heard 10 messages and 2 split sessions from 8 speakers. Pastor Ryan Narsolis was our key speaker, and my wife, along with Abigail Narsolis, spoke to the young ladies. There were great decisions made to serve God and to be spiritually awake. Our auditorium was transformed into a tent on the safari, with occasional roars reminding the young people of the enemy who is always looking to devour. We are praying that the truths preached will continue to work in their hearts.

We also held graduation services for Hyles-Anderson College of the Philippines and for our homeschool ministry. We had 5 graduates from each. We are thankful for each one who finished this step of preparation. Precious Bandoquillo, one of our college graduates, has accepted a position to work with Crossroads Baptist Church in Urdaneta as a teacher in their school. Please pray for her and for all of our graduates as they continue forward in the will of God.

We also praise the Lord for an unusual answer to prayer. For years, a tree has taken up space in our already small parking area and caused a lot of mess. That tree recently fell. We are thankful that it fell toward the highway, crushing the front gate but not damaging the building. The extra parking space will be a real help and an answer to prayer as we continue to outgrow the space we have.

On a personal note, I am thankful to share that two books are being released. The first, *Biblical Principles for Dating*, should be available any day now. The second, a parenting book, entitled *Before the Apple Falls*, will be coming soon. More information is available at www.soulwinning.com. Our prayer is that these resources will strengthen homes, help young people, and encourage families to follow Bible principles.



Please be in prayer for the following:

1. Pray for our son Christian and Leah Markowski as they prepare to be married on August 21, 2026. After their wedding, they will be on full-time deputation to come join us as missionaries in the Philippines.
2. Pray for International Baptist Church to get land and a building of its own—we are out of space. I would like to have 4 new adult classes by the end of next year, but we have no place to put them. We need the Lord to open the right door.
3. Pray for a strong vehicle to help bring people to church from an area a little distance from the church. Bro. Williams and his wife have families coming from this area, but it is hard to get to without a vehicle with a strong engine. We would like to help them get a vehicle so they can continue reaching these families.
4. Pray for International Baptist Church in Dauin, started by our graduate Nelson Duran in December 2025. They are seeing souls saved weekly, and the church is growing.
5. Pray for the projects we are developing for the coming year, including our year-long discipleship program, *Valiant Christianity*, and a Wednesday evening children's program, *Bible Heroes Academy*.

Thank you for your faithful prayers and support. We are grateful for the privilege of serving the Saviour here in Dumaguete and for the part you have in helping us reach this corner of the world.

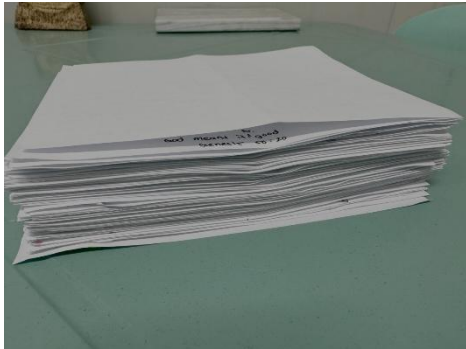

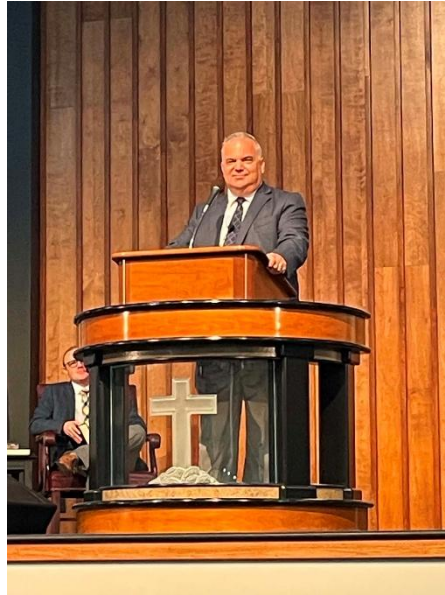

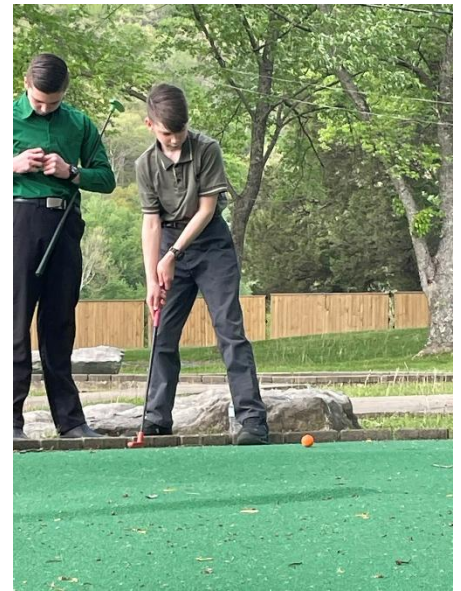

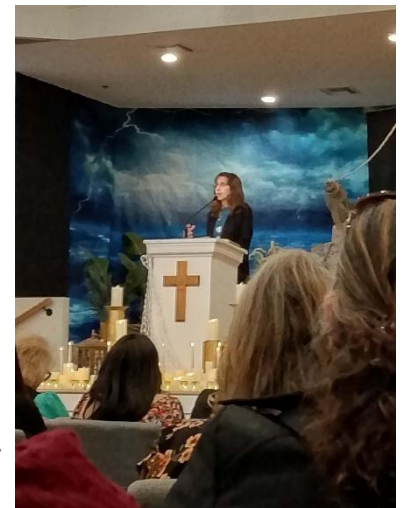
